# APPLYING DIGITAL CURATION PRINCIPLES IN PRACTICAL SETTINGS

### A FRAMEWORK FOR IMPLEMENTING FIELD EXPERIENCES FROM THE DIGCCURR PROJECT








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#### **Abstract**

The **DigCCurr I** (Digital Curation Curriculum) project is concluding development of a graduate-level curricular framework, course modules, and experiential components. This **poster** reports on the project's **Carolina Digital Curation Fellowship (CDCF)** program's practicum component (2007-09).

There's tremendous growth in digital curation professional opportunities. To fill these new professional roles, there is need for education to prepare students for digital curation work in a variety of information organizations. The success of **DigCCurr** I in meeting this need has contributed to additional IMLS-funding for several digital curation curriculum projects at UNC-CH as well as a growing international network of digital curation educators.<sup>1</sup>



#### **Evaluation**
